Field trips to explore public and private nature restoration initiatives

showcasing landowners' engagement in biodiversity conservation within two pilot programmes of LIFE-IP LatViaNature (*Blooming Meadows* and *Living Forest*) will take place in Vidzeme region.

Volunteer event (practical habitat management) will take place near Lake Kanieris while participants will engage in hands-on conservation work, surrounded by the scenic landscapes of Ķemeri National Park.

Here the nearby Rieksti Peninsula hosts four EU importance habitats, including molinia meadows, calcareous fens, and juniper formations, as well as rare plant species like *Liparis loeselii*, listed under the Habitats Directive.
