Grassland situation – THE FACTS

- Semi natural grasslands in Latvia are disappearing less than 1% of the territory
- This is the most species rich ecosystem in our region the loss is immense
- This ecosystem is linked to human actions and thus directly dependent on landowners' decisions and agricultural policy



60 thousand hectares

or **0.9%** of the territory of Latvia or **3.4%** of the agricultural land of Latvia*



The most species-rich ecosystem of Latvia – more than

50 plant species

can coexist in one square metre of natural grasslands.



The most endangered habitat group in Latvia, which is rapidly disappearing*. Their area has shrunk

by more than 97%

over the past hundred years.



WHO CARES??

- Problems that people are most concerned about in nature:
- Deforestation 35%
- Waste and environmental pollution 20%
- Climate change 5%
- Loss of biodiversity 4%
- Irresponsible human behaviour 3%

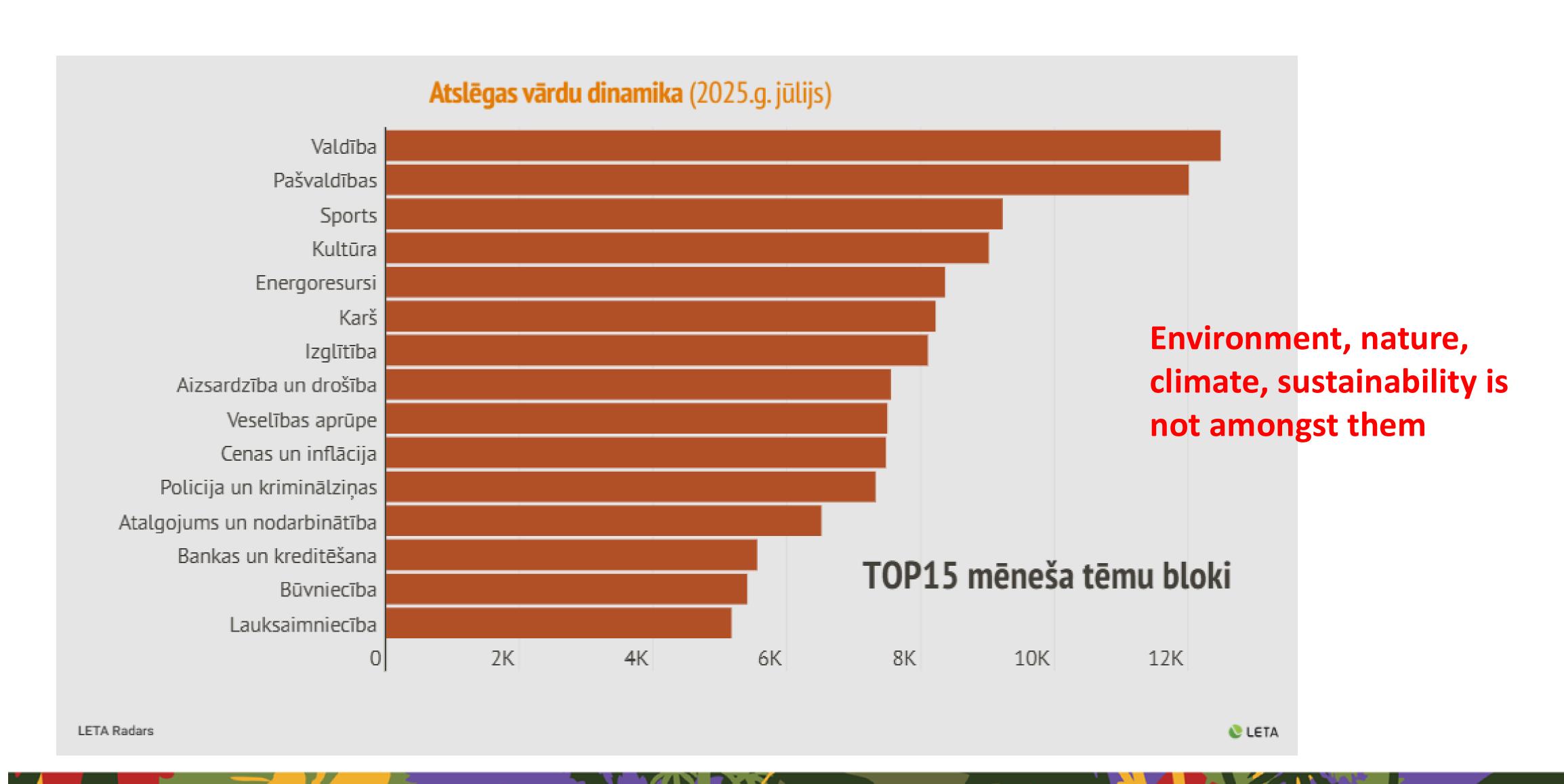

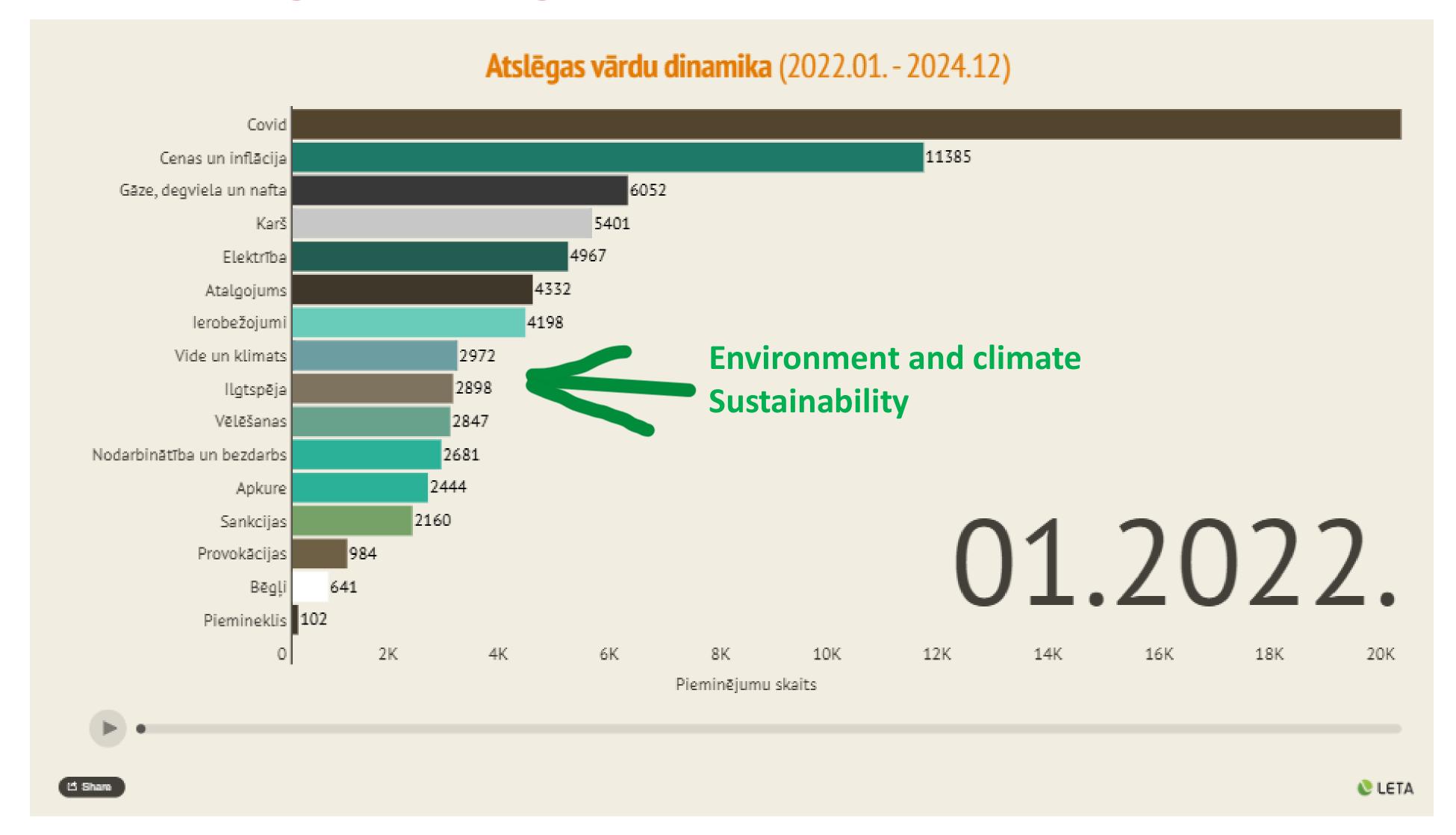


Top 15 keywords in Latvian media discourse in July 2025

What has happened?

- If COVID-19 was a time when nature re-emerged in public consciousness seen as a place of refuge and consolation—the current geopolitical situation has drastically shifted priorities.
 - Today, the focus lies on defence, security, and economic stability.
- In times of war, people turn their attention to **conflict** and to **entertainment** as a distraction from hardship. Nature is not among their concerns.
- At the same time, the shift away from the Green Deal at the EU level and the changing positioning of environmental issues are reshaping public perception.
- Are grasslands merely a "nice-to-have"? A luxury we can afford only when we feel safe and prosperous?
- Yet we know that stable ecosystems form the very foundation of our existence—and thus of security itself. Still, immediate threats inevitably take precedence.

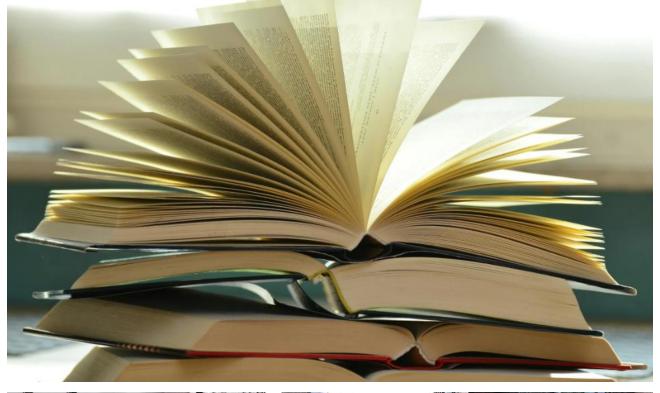

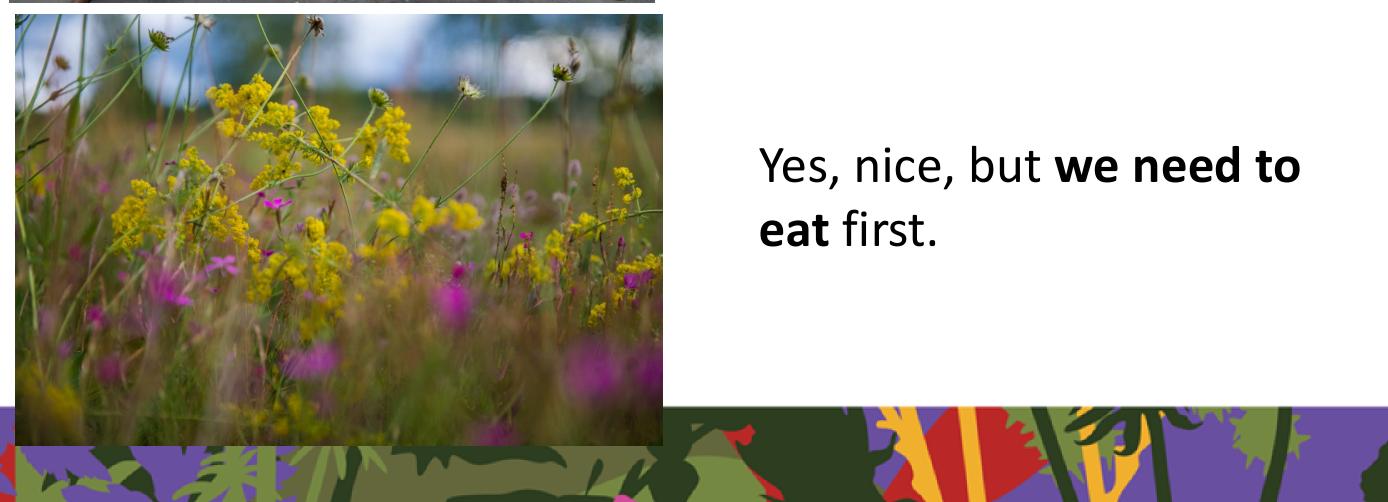
